OBITUARY
OF
CLARENCE FUGETT

Our Father, which art in heaven;
Hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come;
Thy WILL BE DONE.....

AND SO IT WAS, CLARENCE FUGETT, the giant who came to be known simply as COKE among friends and acquaintances and as DADDY COKE or COKE DADDY by his four generations of affectionate grandchildren, departed this life on April 6, 1993. His passing honors the marriage vow to GUSSIE LOWE promising to remain committed until death do them part. COKE was the eldest of five children blessed to the union of NEWTON FUGETT and TAMER TYNER FUGETT. COKE was born on March 30, 1900 in Lorena, and began to reside in Waurika in 1917 upon the move of his parents to Oklahoma.

COKE is preceded in death by his parents and two of his fifteen children, Ethel Mae Fugett Dennis and James C. Fugett.

COKE worshiped and united with the Mt. Zion Baptist church in Waurika under the pastoral guidance of the late Colley Andrew where he served on the Deacon Board before moving to Gainesville, Texas. COKE then joined Mt. Olive Baptist Church in Gainesville and continued to serve as a deacon. Finally, COKE moved to Duncan in 1963, making Antioch Baptist Church under the pastoral guidance of Rev. F.W. Whitaker his last church home. COKE continued to remain faithful to God throughout his years of service to Antioch Baptist Church under the guidance of Pastor Ronald Boyd. He demonstrated his love and commitment to his church not only in support and attendance; but also by leading devotion and serving on the Deacon Board.

FUGETT'S employment history spans more than 75 years. For nine years, FUGETT was employed in Waurika by Kelly's Farms and later employed fifty-one years by Compress Companies in Gainesville, Sherman, and Wichita Falls, Texas.

FUGETT briefly retired in 1965 but discovered himself too energetic for retirement. He reentered the work force as a part time employee of the Oklahoma National Bank in Duncan for five years. FUGETT then returned to worked for Texas Warehouse & Compress Company in Gainesville for ten additional years before finally retiring in 1983.

Survivors include his beloved wife, GUSSIE FUGETT, of the home, one brother, L.B. Fugett of Oklahoma City, one sister, Sarah Kirkland, of Wichita Falls, seven daughters, CARRIE M. BELL, of Chickasha, DOROTHY BOYDSTON, of Topeka, PEARLYNE LAWRENCE, of Gainesville, Verna Williams, of Duncan, MAURICE CRAWFORD, of Oklahoma City, HELEN PHELPS, of Sherman, JOYCE RICKS, of Tacoma.

Six sons, LEE OTIS GIBSON and CLARENCE FUGETT JR., of Oklahoma City, PAUL FUGETT, of Los Angeles, MICHAEL FUGETT, of Dallas, GERALD FUGETT, Oklahoma city, COY FUGETT, of Duncan. COKE DADDY'S 77 grandchildren, 109 great-grandchildren, 44 great-great-grandchildren, 3 great-great-great-grandchildren survive his passing along with numerous son and daughter-in-laws, nieces and nephews.
