

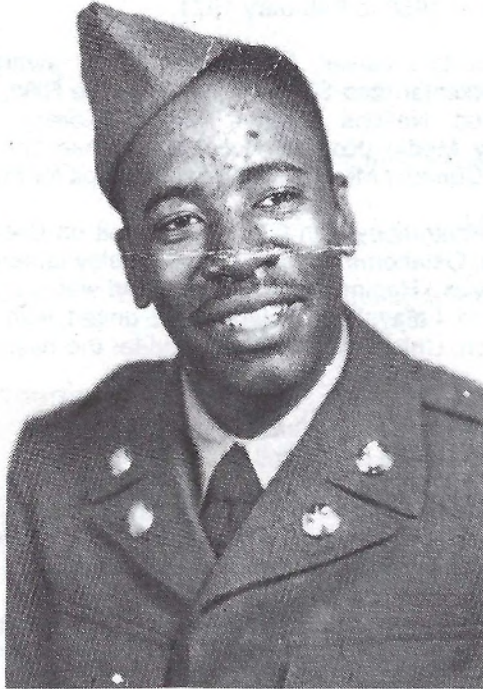

OBITUARY

Wesley Bell, Sr. was born in Alexandria, Louisiana on July 21, 1929. He was the youngest of five children born to William and Annie Lou Bell. Wesley departed this life on December 4, 1992 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma following a lengthy illness.

Wesley first attended public school in Alexandria, Louisiana until 1943 when he moved to Okmulgee, Oklahoma. There he completed his education and began a twenty year career in the United States Army from November 1950 to February 1971.

During his military career, he received many awards and medals, including Marksman and Sharpshooter with the Rifle, Korean Conflict Medal, United Nations Service Medal (Korea), Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal (Korea), National Defense Service Medal and seven Good Conduct Medals with Bronze Loops for military service.

He united in matrimony with Carrie M. Fugett on December 19, 1953 at Chickasha, Oklahoma. Of this union, Wesley fathered four children, Myra, Wesley Jr., Reginald and Marletta and was stepfather to Estella M. Moore and Lafayette L. Flack. He united with the New Hope Baptist Church, Chickasha, Oklahoma under the pastoral of Rev. G.S. Collins.

Wesley is preceded in death by both parents, three brothers: Ferdinand, Alfred and Leroy Bell.

Wesley is survived by his wife, Carrie M. Bell, sons and daughters, Lafayette L. Flack, Reginald Bell, Myra Bell, Marletta Richie and Estella Moore, all of Chickasha and son, Wesley Jr., Oklahoma City. He is also survived by a brother, Andrew, and sister, Florida, both of Alexandria, Louisiana; and a stepbrother, McKinley Bell and wife, Vera of Flint, Michigan; thirteen grandchildren, sixteen great-grandchildren and many other relatives and friends.
